Arrival and Fellowship – Thursday, 16 October & 17 Friday, October

arrived on Thursday, October 16. Brother Dare Abioye, a minister from our Germany church, arrived the following morning, Friday, October 17.


Upon arrival that Thursday evening, Brother Francis traveled to Troyes accompanied by our France church Pastor, Sister Patricia Sossa, and her husband, Brother Jean Sossa. They visited the Hounyê family—Brother Remi, Sister Veronique, and their daughter, Sister Morgane. We enjoyed a warm time of fellowship over a delicious meal, followed by a prayer session for the family.



Friday, 17 October 2025, Opening Revival Service.

The revival program commenced with an Evangelistic and Revival Service led by Sister Patricia Sossa. The evening began with praise and worship, featuring a trombone solo titled "God, I Am Here to Adore You" by Brother Ethan Sossa.

We were blessed by powerful testimonies from Sister Morgane Hounyê, Brother Joël Vimadje, Brother Mathieu Bobo, Brother Francis Odudu, and Sister Ruth Vimadje, who shared the marvelous works God had done in their lives.



Following this, Sister Morgane Hounyê ministered in song, and Sister Patricia Sossa delivered the first sermon titled "God Has Not Forgotten You", based on 1 Samuel 1:1–20. She reminded us of Hannah's story—a woman barren and scorned, yet remembered by God.

Hannah had a husband, but no children. She hadn't obtained what she had married for. Therefore, she wasn't fulfilled. Worse still, her rival constantly mortified her, causing her to resent the fact that the Lord had made her barren.

"What situation in your life is the enemy using to afflict your soul and spirit? Tell your neighbor: God has not forgotten you!"

Hannah had a need, but she knew where to find the solution—at Shiloh, in the house of the Lord. Likewise, we are in the right place, where God saves, sanctifies, baptizes, heals, and provides answers. "All things are possible to him who believes" and "Nothing is impossible with God."

Hannah's vow to dedicate her child to the Lord teaches us that fulfillment often comes when we surrender fully to God. Her story ended in joy: "The Lord remembered Hannah," and she bore a son, Samuel.

"Can a woman forget her sucking child? ... They may may forget, yet will I not forget thee. Behold, I have graven thee upon the palms of My hands." – Isaiah 49:15–16



Saturday, 18 October 2025 Bible Teaching, Seminar, and Revival Service

The morning devotional was led by Reverend Francis Odudu, Regional Director for Mainland Europe, who came from the UK to support the revival. His message, "Restoring or Renewing Our Relationship with God: Christian Experiences," began with greetings from himself, his wife, and the Western Europe Board of Directors.





He read Titus 2:11–15 and emphasized the need for reconciliation with God through repentance. He explained salvation using Genesis 5:3, Romans 3:23, Matthew 4:17, and Acts 17:30, and showed how to obtain it through Isaiah 55:7, 1 John 1:9, John 6:37, and Romans 8:16.

He then taught on sanctification, referencing 1 Peter 1:15–16, 1 Thessalonians 5:23, and John 17:17, stressing that holiness is essential to walk with God. He concluded with the promise of the baptism of the Holy Spirit, supported by Acts 1:8, John 7:38–39, and Acts 2:1, 39. The message moved the congregation to deep reconciliation with God.

At 2:30 p.m., a seminar titled "Marriage and the Christian Home" was presented by Brother Joël and Sister Suzanne Vimadje. Their practical insights encouraged young singles to trust God's timing in finding their life partners.

The day ended with a spiritual revival and evangelistic service, led by Brother Degnon VIMADJE, the youth leader. His message, entitled "The Desert: A Painful but Necessary Process for Your Elevation," drew on 2 Kings 20:1-5, showing that God sometimes uses trials to prepare His children for greater blessings, as He did for Hezekiah.

He also quoted Isaiah 41:17-18 to encourage God's people: "I will open rivers in high places, and fountains in the midst of the valleys: I will make the widerness a pool of water and the dry land springs of water."

Sunday, 19 October 2025 – Closing Service

After Sunday school and a special children's program, the closing devotional was led by Brother Dare Abioye. His sermon, "These Things Are From Me," drew from Romans 11:33–36 and 1 Kings 12:24, explaining that God sometimes permits discomfort to draw us closer to Him. He reminded us of Jeremiah 29:13: "You will seek Me and find Me when you seek Me with all your heart."

Throughout the weekend, the presence of the Lord was evident. Many were touched, encouraged, and spiritually renewed. We give all glory to God for the blessings received, the hearts transformed, and the ongoing work He is doing in France.

May this moment of Spiritual Revival mark the beginning of a new season of grace and growth.
