DAY 1 – FRIDAY, 7 NOVEMBER



The meetings began with an online prayer service featuring two congregational hymns, two special songs, and two prayer sessions.

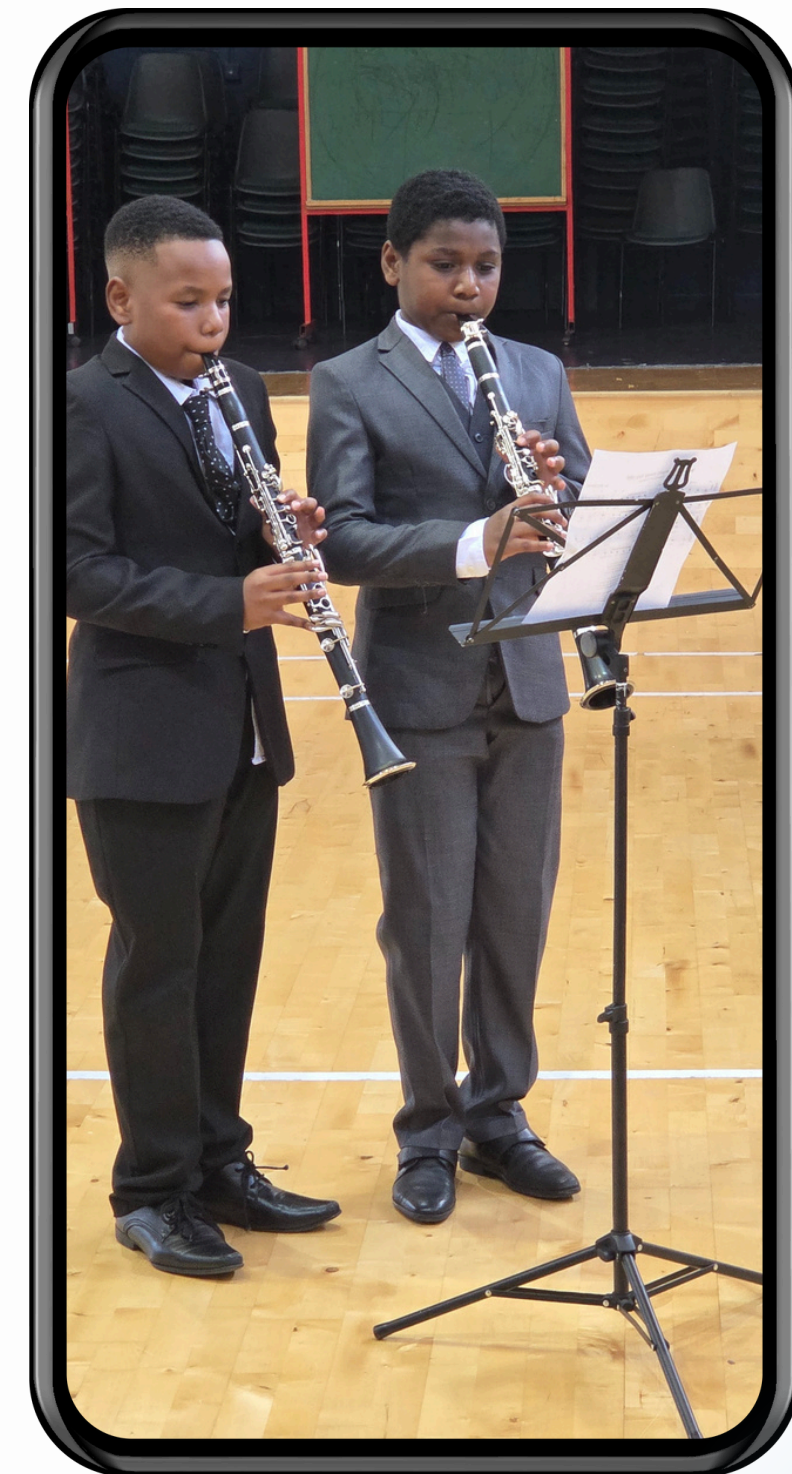


DAY 2 – SATURDAY, 8 NOVEMBER: YOUTH FORUM



Program included inspiring musical presentations and Bible-based activities. Highlights included:

DAY 2 CONT.

Speakers:

1. Brother Deji Ojebantale (Leicester) – “Insight into Career Progression in Ireland and Europe” He encouraged spiritual growth alongside earthly success, stressing diligence, mentorship, continuous upskilling, and trusting God’s favour and wisdom.
2. Reverend Mark Mfandarahwa (District Superintendent, Western Europe) – Main Guest Minister Speaking on “Come unto Me,” he urged young people to put Christ first, using examples from Daniel and Joseph. He testified how God preserved his job during economic downturns and guided career transitions. He closed by defining true success as integrity, holiness, and godliness, followed by congregational prayer and the theme song.

The day ended with the hymn “Praise Him, Praise Him” and a closing prayer by Sister Marble Mfandarahwa, followed by fellowship and a finger buffet.





DAY 3 – SUNDAY, 9 NOVEMBER



Sunday School Opened with “Come Now Is the Time to Worship” and “Our Father and Our God.” The children presented “Every Day with Jesus,” followed by a Search Class lesson on “Brotherly Kindness” taught by Sister Marble. The choir sang “Let There Be Love Shared Among Us,” leading into a powerful prayer for God’s love to fill every heart.

Brother Moses Itanola led the congregation in “Come unto Me, Ye Weary,” and Brother Marshall Mburuma prayed for open hearts. Testimonies celebrated God’s saving, protecting, healing, and delivering power. The theme song was sung again.

Message – Reverend Mark Mfandarahwa Reading Matthew 11:28–29, he presented Jesus as the only One who keeps every promise and lightens every burden. Jesus gives soul-rest, peace, healing, provision, and strength. Personal testimonies included God providing a house during the UK recession and sustaining the family through trials. He extended an altar call with Isaiah 1:18–19, inviting all to come to Christ for forgiveness, peace, and blessing. Many responded and tarried at the altar. The service closed with “Come Oh Come While Christ Is Calling.”
