MIGHTY TO SAVE!

WOULD God that the words "Mighty to Save!" were emblazoned in letters of fire across the skies of the sinsick countries today. There is only One who is mighty to save, and that is Christ the Redeemer. Armament, air forces, manpower, and the ingenuity of military science cannot, save; Christ alone is mighty to save. That is a consolation to the hearts of Christians who know the hope of eternal life, who have the assurance in their hearts of that saving power of the living God.

Salvation is the one word found in the Scriptures that may be considered the all-inclusive word of the Gospel. It takes in the work of redemption from the very first holy desire one has in his heart to seek God, and is consummated at the glorification of the saints of the Most High. The wonderful work of redemption through Christ is salvation. This world needs it! Humanity needs it! Individuals need it!

Repentance is Necessary

The condition of salvation is that the sinner must repent. Jesus said, "Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3). He is not only able to save those who repent, but He is able to put a desire into the hearts of sinners to repent. That is what we call conviction.

Repentance comes with a burning desire to forsake sin and to turn to God. The secret of Christian victory comes through having a godly sorrow for sin. John the Apostle said, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (I John 1:9).

A Never-Changing Gospel

The more you know of the Gospel the more you find it to be the same truth which was always known. It does not change; it does not vary ; it does not alter its position. The Gospel stands eternally the same and has a solution for every problem of modern men's lives as well as it had for the ancients. The Gospel of Christ and His salvation is the need of the hour and it is the only remedy for the world's ills. "I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save" (Isaiah 63:1).

Mighty! Powerful! Mighty to give men new hearts! Mighty to turn them from their sinful desires and give them a leaning toward holy desires — righteous ambitions! It takes God to do that. stabilization into the hearts that are rent and torn with fear and disappointment, with sorrow and anguish. It will take Christ! He alone is mighty to save!

He can change human hearts. He can make men who once hated holiness love it, lean toward it, yearn after it, and cry for it. Do you appreciate the Gospel today as you never have before? Do you thank God for a deep-seated faith in your heart, a groundwork that is laid there that has created a ballast in these stormy waters to carry you through the storms to a haven of rest and safety? It is the "faith of our fathers! living still in spite of dungeon, fire, and sword."

A Miracle-Working God

The life of a real Christian, the life of a true believer, is one series of miracles. That statement cannot be challenged. There are too many witnesses who have proved the living, miracle-working power of an omnipotent God. He is the same yesterday and today and forever. He gives us power, as we believe His Word, to brush aside every obstacle that mounts up before us, and to triumph gloriously! He does not save a man and then let him drift on his own resources. Not at all! When Christ saves you He prepares you for a conflict; He gives you something to do. Of course, it is not to lie down and be carried to the skies on flowery beds of ease; but He takes you into His armoury and puts armour upon you. He gives you something to do and enables you to go forth and do it. You will fight the good fight of faith; you will lay hold on eternal life. You will get a grip on the eternal promise of God. It will carry you through, no matter what the conflict.

Temptation may strike you in an unexpected hour — at a moment when you think of it the least — but the power of God's promises which have been laid in your heart will give you strength to surmount every difficulty or temptation.

The Word says: "Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6).

What encouragement these promises bring to us! Pray on, believer! You have something to guarantee an answer to your prayers. You have the immutable, incontestable Word of Almighty God's promises. No enemy will ever overthrow that; no enemy will ever succeed in defeating you so long as you are standing upon God's promises. When you get a grip upon the Hand that rules the universe you can see things come to pass.
